Safe Return to In-person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan

Schools are an essential part of community infrastructure and the return to in-person instruction for K-12 students is a priority. The purpose of this document is to provide information on prevention strategies that help protect students, teachers, and staff and slow the spread of COVID-19 in K-12 schools based on updated CDC guidelines.

The plan for the 2021-2022 Campbell County School District school year is subject to change based upon current conditions and information provided by local, state, and federal agencies.

Prevention strategies

SARS-CoV-2 transmission in K-12 schools is largely influenced by disease incidence in the community and evidence from the 2020-2021 school year suggests K-12 schools can safely open for in-person instruction when layered prevention strategies are implemented. Factors that influence decisions include:

- Level of community transmission of COVID-19 and occurrence of outbreaks in the school or community.
- COVID-19 vaccination coverage in the community and among students, teachers, and staff.
- Ages of children served by the schools and associated social and behavioral factors that may affect the risk of transmission and feasibility of different prevention strategies.

Full implementation of all layers of protection will be followed when sustained incidence of COVID-19 in the county is accelerated or high (orange or red). If any of the prevention strategies are removed or added, they will be implemented one at a time and clearly communicated to our school community.

Vaccination

We encourage a COVID vaccine for anyone eligible to safely receive the vaccination. We respect and understand individual/family choice on this topic. We must note the current quarantine flexibility available to fully vaccinated people who are not symptomatic. This flexibility greatly improves the district's ability to provide high quality in-person learning environments.

Health Assessment at Home

Parents should complete a quick health assessment on their child, including a temperature check, before sending their student to school. If there are no symptoms observed, the student should proceed to school as normal regardless of transportation mode.

Employees should complete a quick health assessment, including a temperature check, before reporting to work. Ill/ symptomatic employees should stay home and report absence with CCS Human Resource Department.

Anyone who is ill or symptomatic, should contact their health care provider. Current COVID-19 testing and quarantine protocol shall be followed when applicable.

Health Assessment at School

Each CCS school has a school nurse available to see ill students and employees. If a person shows at least one symptom (fever, chills, shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, new cough, new loss of taste or smell

or gastrointestinal symptoms), they must be isolated immediately. Parents will be required to pick up the child. Individuals are encouraged to notify their health care provider for further guidance and possible testing for COVID-19. Current return to school/ work and quarantine protocol shall be followed when applicable.

Hand Hygiene

Students shall be taught proper hand hygiene practices. Signs and reminders shall be posted throughout buildings. Regular hand-washing and use of hand sanitizer shall be planned into the school day.

Social Distancing

Campbell County will follow current CDC guidance on social distancing to assist in slowing the spread of the virus. Social distancing shall be practiced as much as feasible in the school setting.

Cleaning and Sanitization

Campbell County School shall follow the current CDC guidance for cleaning and sanitizing a facility.

Quarantine

Campbell County Schools will follow current CDC guidance for quarantine. This includes factors such as vaccines, masks, social distancing, and exposure.

Face Coverings

Campbell County Schools will require all persons to wear masks while indoors in all settings, unless otherwise exempted, regardless of COVID vaccination status.

Bus Transportation

All persons must wear a mask while on a school bus regardless of COVID vaccination status. A bus driver does not need to wear a mask if they are the only person on the bus.

Additional school bus protocol:

- Enhanced cleaning and sanitizing protocols will be followed on each bus.
- When possible, air flow will be increased on all buses.
- Each rider shall have an assigned seat.
- No bus passes will be permitted.
- To the extent possible, seats will be filled from back to front when boarding.
- Each bus will have a roster of eligible student riders (passenger manifest) and document the assigned seats for contact tracing. At morning routes, rider attendance will be documented on the manifest before unloading at school.
- Leave first seat behind the driver empty.
- Load back to front and unload front to back.
- Stagger seating if not at full capacity.
- For afternoon routes, rider attendance will be documented on the manifest before the bus leaves the school.

Food Service Meals

Campbell County Schools has a plan to focus on food service operations inside the school buildings. The specific food service plan for each individual school will be unique given the number of students enrolled, age of students, and layout of the school building. The building layout includes the kitchen, cafeteria, and service lines.

Breakfast and lunch meals will be provided on school days at NO CHARGE for 2021-2022 to all enrolled students. Additional meals and food services will be provided to families per the current USDA guidelines. Free/ Reduced Meal Applications are still necessary and should be completed on the benefit application.

Attendance

During the 2021-2022 school year, all Kentucky Revised Statutes and Kentucky Administrative Regulations related to attendance shall be observed and enforced by Campbell County Schools.

Teaching and Learning Model

Students in grades K-12 will attend school in-person 5 days per week.

Preschool students will attend school in-person following the normal 4-day, Monday through Thursday, schedule.

When a student, grades K-12, is unable to attend school due to a physical or emotional medical issue or disability and meets the home/hospital criteria, the student can be provided instructional services through the school district's Home/Hospital Instructional Program. A home/ hospital instructional session may be delivered in person or electronically.

Athletics/Extra-Curricular Activities

All guidance in this document is applicable to athletics/extra-curricular activities. Athletics governed by KHSAA must follow their requirements.
